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Communication Deadly Sins

There are many classroom practices that hinder the development of effective communication. We like to think of them as “deadly communication sins”. We’ve all committed these sins at one time or another in the course of our practice. Each month we highlight a ‘deadly sin’ related to communication and describe how to implement a positive communication practice in place of the deadly sin.

Sin: Too many pictures on the display

Solve: Use words that have multiple messages!

GO

May I go?
Go to the Gym.
Let’s Go!
Get set, Go!
Let’s go home.

LIKE

I Like it!
I like movies!
What do you like?
I like your hat.
I like you!

Remember, communication is hard work!
We have to make it worth the effort.

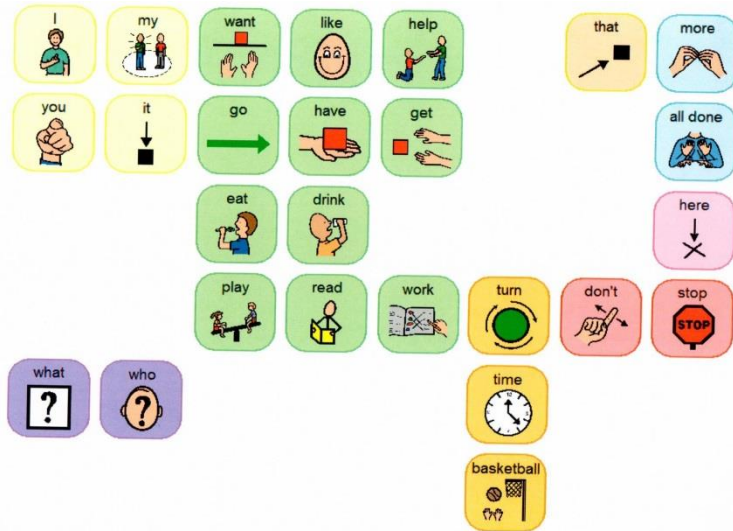
